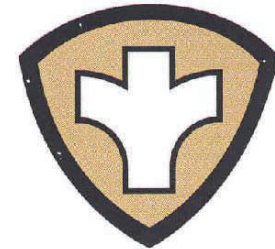

Services/Programs

Environmental Health

- * Inspection and licensing of food/drink serving establishments and temporary events
- * Pool and beach testing
- * Inspection of lodging facilities
- * Inspection of tattoo establishments
- * Lead risk screening for children under age 6
- * Rabies control coordination

Communicable Disease Control

- * Investigation of reportable diseases
- * STD and Hepatitis Counseling
- * HIV testing and partner counseling
- * Tuberculosis skin testing and treatment
- * Counseling for international travelers

Health Promotion

- * Healthy Sheboygan County 2010
- * Health assessment and referral for refugees
- * Kids Activity and Nutrition Coalition
- * Tobacco-Free Sheboygan County Coalition

Immunizations

- * Low cost (\$5 per injection) childhood immunizations offered in Sheboygan and Plymouth (appointment required)
- * Limited immunizations for adults
- * Post injury tetanus shots during business hours

Children and Families

- * Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) supplemental nutrition program for those eligible
- * Prenatal and postpartum home visits
- * Education and information related to parenting, growth & development and childhood health
- * Children with Special Health Care Needs program for needs assessment and referral to community services
- * Services provided in schools, homes, and clinic settings



School Health

- * Hearing and vision screening and referral
- * Counseling for pregnant teens and teen parents
- * Consultation related to issues of public health concern

Emergency Preparedness

- * Information and education regarding preparing for emergencies including: bioterrorism, disasters, pandemic influenza and others

Other Services

- * Walk in services for general information and referral during business hours
- * Information of health nuisances such as head lice and scabies
